Young children love poetry. They revel in its freedom and its capacity to express feelings. They laugh unabashedly at silly poems. A group of children hearing a good poem display a natural attentiveness that is almost impossible for an adult to create. Their eyes grow larger with expectation as the poem develops. During my 25 years of teaching elementary age children, I have never had classroom discipline problems during the reading of an age and grade appropriate poem. The phenomenon seems universal. Something magical happens when a good poem opens children's emerging minds to poetic expression. The intent of this book is to expose children to one form of writing poetry. That form is end-of-line, rhyming poetry. Children as young as kindergarten age understand when simple words rhyme. They love the meter and rhythm of poems that touch their lives. Interface between: Patients, Investigators, CRAS, the Pharmaceutical industry, the University clinics or Study groups

Activities are based on Good Clinical Practice (GCP) - Different national laws and other regulations
- Data quality and patient safety are most important
Study nurses look after patients during a clinical trial - They have a coordinative task in the study center - They support investigators
Different groups of people bring with them the necessary knowledge to be trained as a study nurse: Nurses, Medical assistants or Medical documentation assistants
Study nurse activities before the start of studies: - The contractual matters between the sponsor and the trial center
Collecting all forms required for submission Example: Description of the trial center, CVs of all staff involved in the trial center, Confidentiality declarations
They prepare and accompany inspections or audits by the authorities/the sponsor
After the end of a study: Study nurses help with the archiving of all study documents
